# OVERVIEW

---

The objective of Workforce Opportunities and Residency Cayman (WORC) is to drive social and economic prosperity for the Cayman Islands. This will create the environment to support the full and productive employment of Caymanians and achieve economic prosperity for all residents. In order to attain these objectives, Caymanians need to be educated and trained at international standards to guarantee global competitiveness. An important task in accomplishing this mission, is to determine the labour needs of the country through job postings.

Job postings is considered one of the leading indicators of labour demand in the short term, as employers advertise as a signal to hire persons. It is a procyclical measure as the number of job postings increase during an economic expansion and decrease during an economic contraction. Given that the Cayman Islands economy is currently navigating its way out of the pandemic, it is expected that job postings should increase as the economy returns to and exceeds its pre-pandemic level.

The purpose of this report is to provide a description of job postings by different classifications each month. Additionally, a year-to-date analysis is conducted to determine the trend of each variable. This information will be useful to attain a deeper understanding of the labour market as job postings is one of the key indicators in predicting labour demand.

In particular, this report will provide the government and other key stakeholders a synopsis of the knowledge and skills needed for the near future. This will then inform the training and development needs of the current and future workforce to meet labour demand. This information will also assist individuals and businesses to adjust to change as well as build and sustain competencies for future labour market needs. It should be noted that the data in this report represents jobs posted only through the Jobs Cayman portal of WORC.

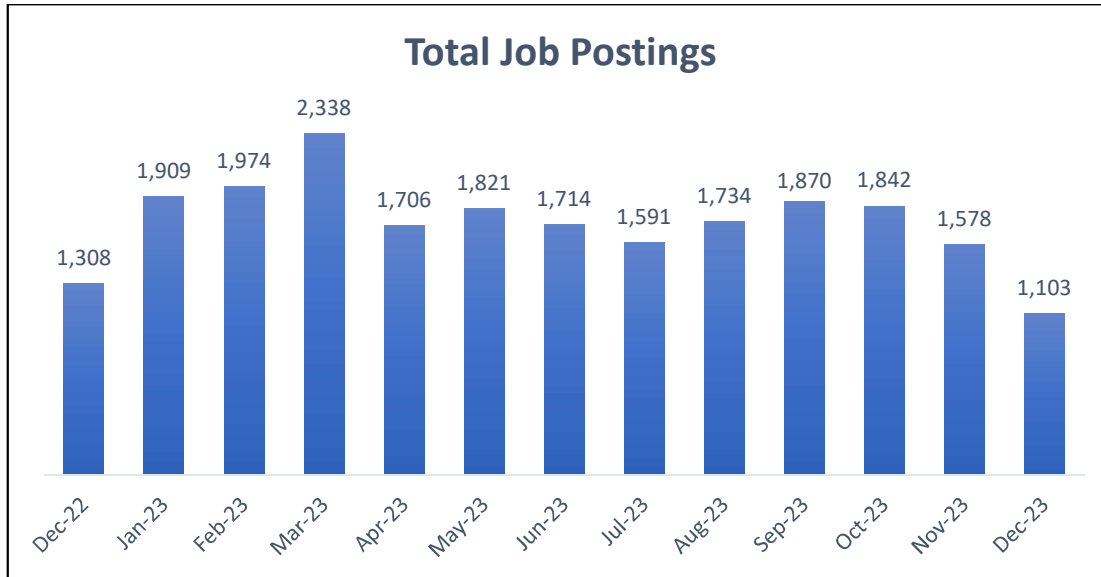

## Total Job Postings

A total of 1,103 jobs were posted during December 2023 relative to 1,578 postings in the previous month and 1,308 postings in December 2022 (see Figure 1). For the full calendar year in 2023, there were 20,180 job advertisements compared with 19,793 advertisements in 2022.

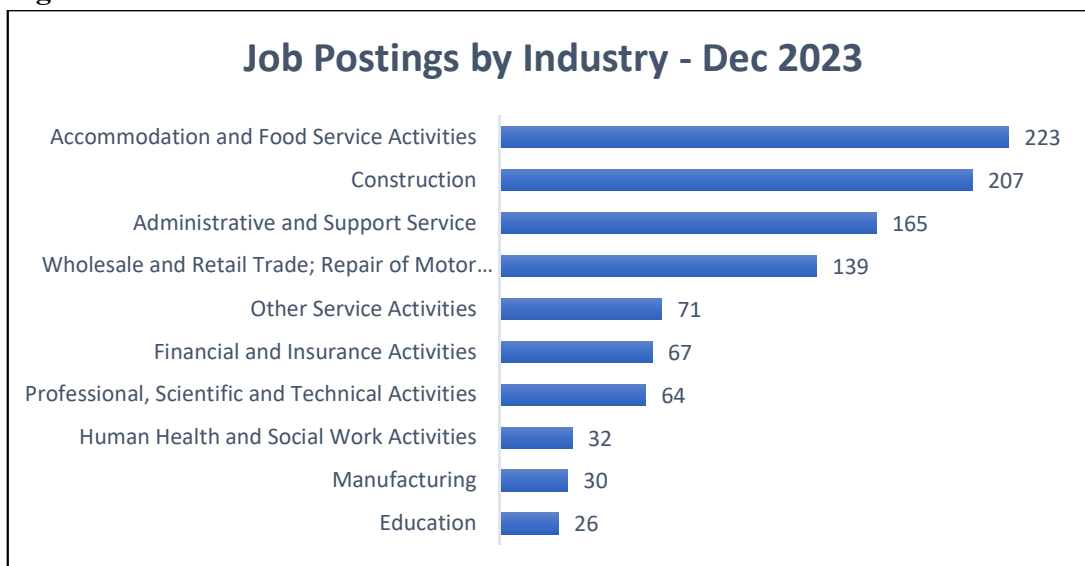

## Industry

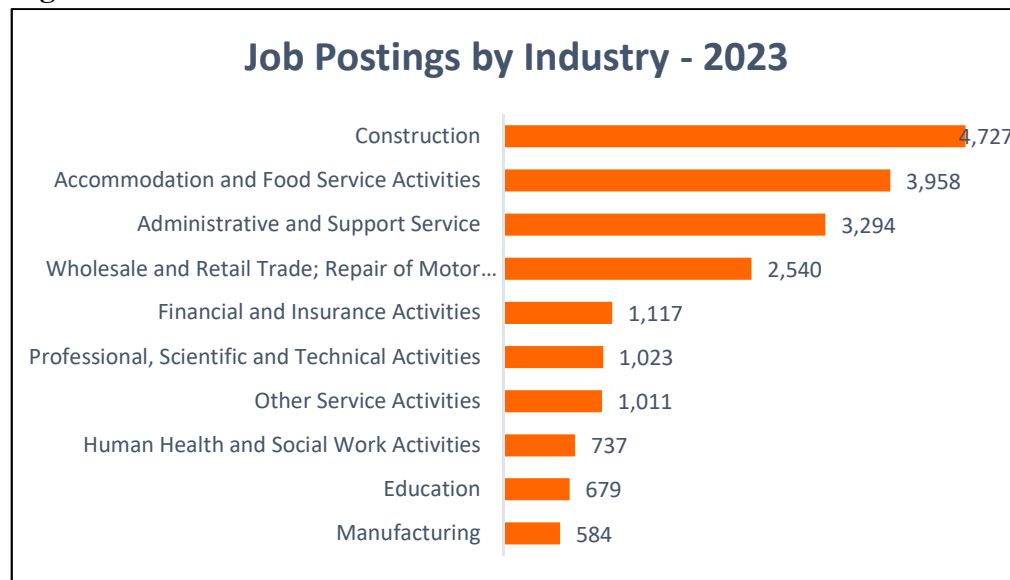
The Accommodation and Food Service Activities industry accounted for 223 job postings, representing 20.2 percent of the total number of job openings in December 2023 (see Figure 2). The Construction industry followed with 207 job advertisements (18.8%) while the Administrative and Support Service Activities industry recorded 165 job openings (15.0%).

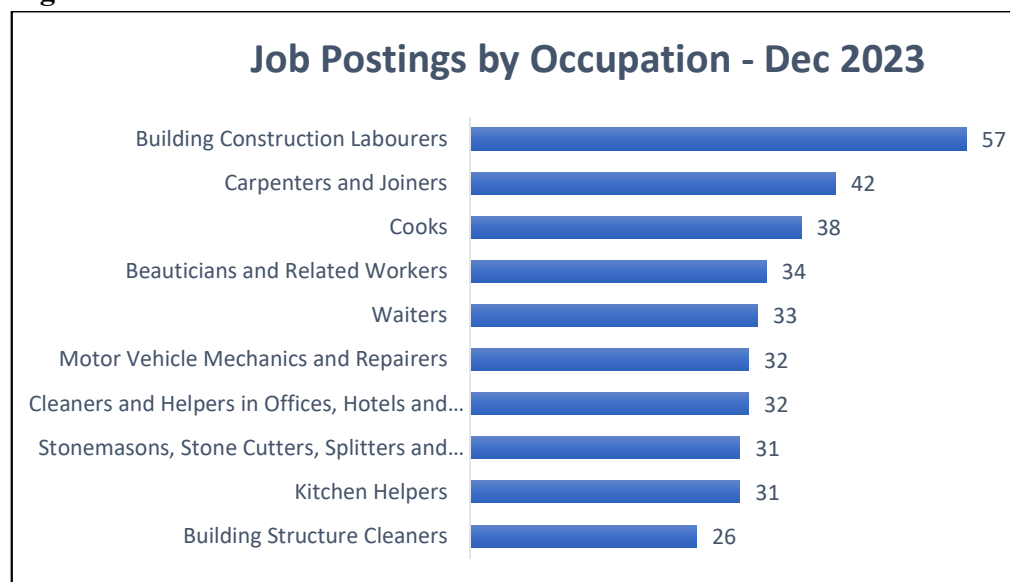
**Figure 3.**

For 2023, the Construction industry accounted for most job postings, recording 4,727 or 22.3 percent of the total (see Figure 3). The Accommodation and Food Service Activities industry followed with 3,958 job advertisements (18.7%) while the Administrative and Support Service Activities industry registered 3,294 job openings (15.6%).

## Occupation

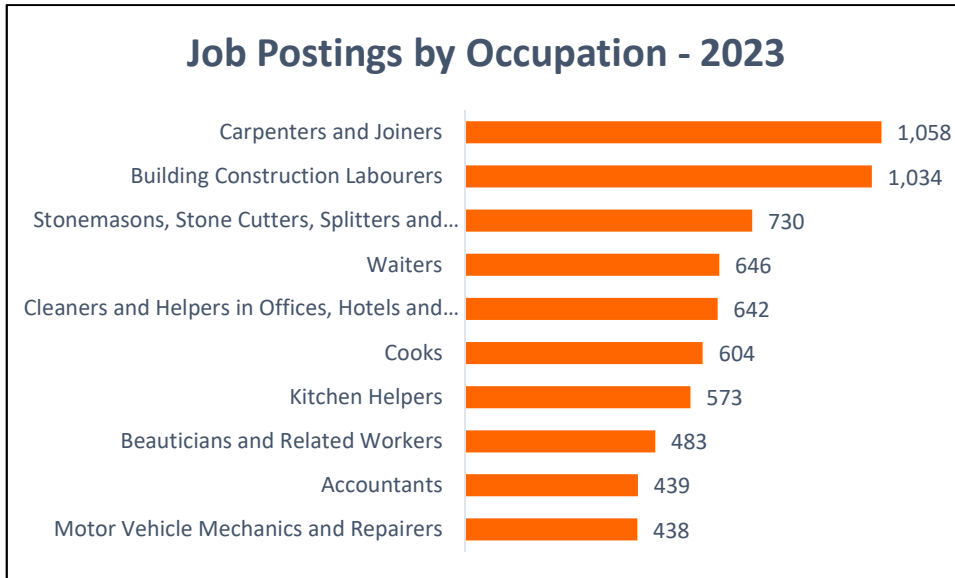
In December 2023, building construction labourers accounted for 57 job postings which represented 5.2 percent of all job openings (see Figure 4). Carpenters and joiners followed with 42 job advertisements (3.8%) while cooks recorded 38 job postings (3.4% of the total).

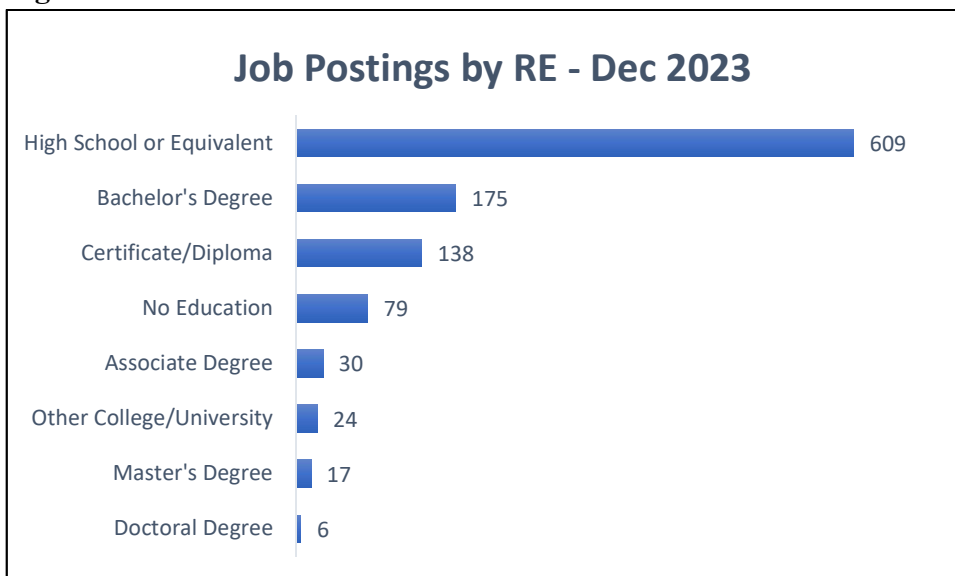
**Figure 5.**

For 2023, carpenters and joiners accounted for 1,058 job postings which represented 5.0 percent of all job advertisements (see Figure 5). The next largest occupation was building construction labourers with 1,034 job postings (4.9%) preceded by stonemasons, stone cutters, splitters and carvers with 730 job openings or 3.4 percent of the total.

## Required Education (RE)

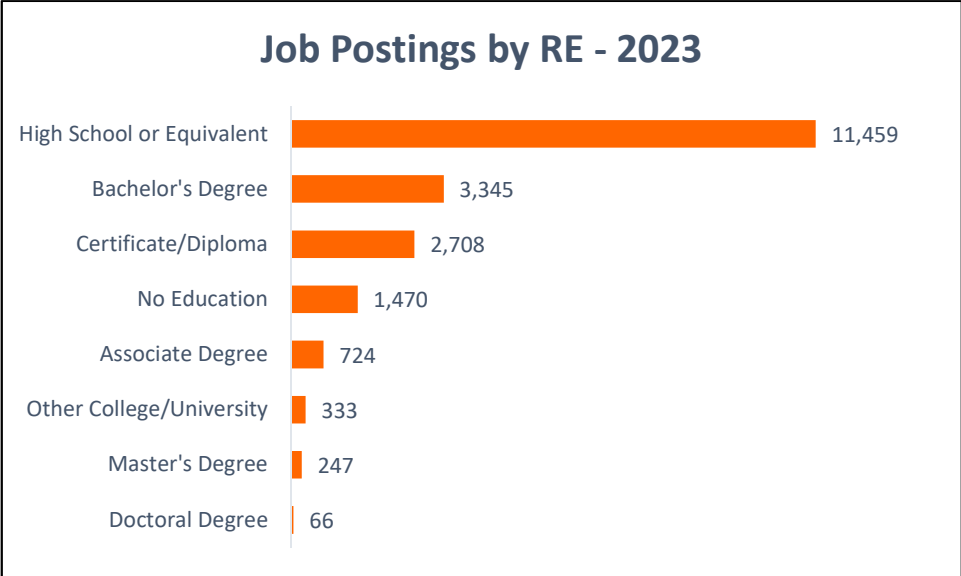
There were 1,078 job postings that specified the required level of education in December 2023. Of this amount, 609 postings (56.5%) required persons with a high school or equivalent qualification, 175 (16.2%) required persons with a Bachelor’s Degree and 138 (12.8%) required persons with a certificate or diploma (see Figure 6).

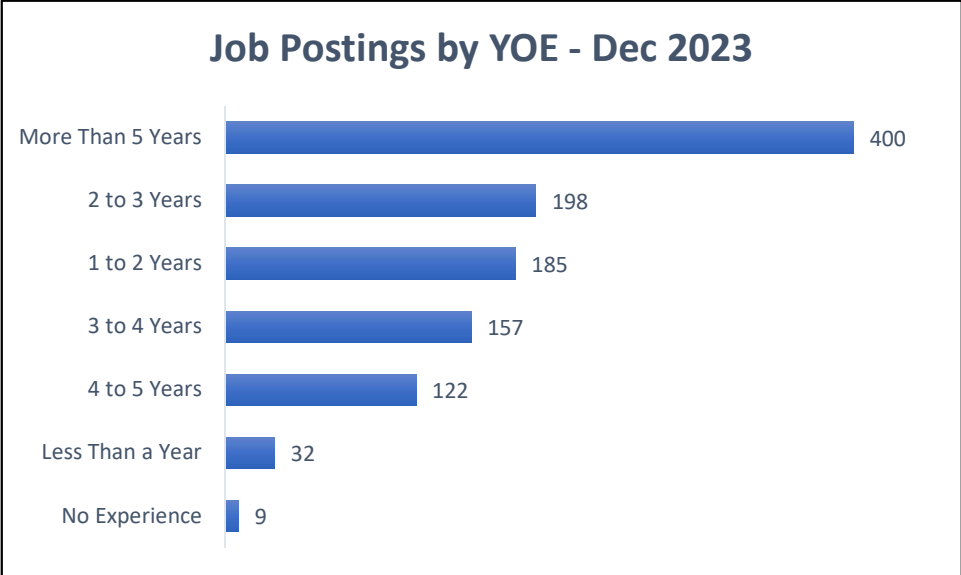
**Figure 7.**

A total of 20,352 job postings specified the required level of education in 2023. During this period, 11,459 postings (56.3%) required persons with a high school or equivalent qualification, 3,345 (16.4%) required persons with a Bachelor’s Degree and 2,708 (13.3%) required persons with a certificate or diploma (see Figure 7).

## Years of Experience (YOE)

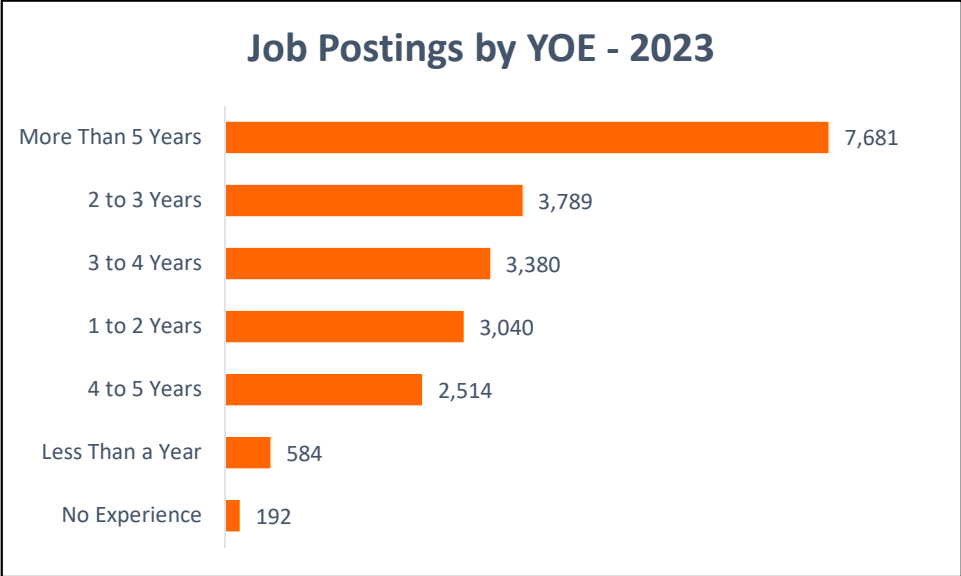
In December 2023, 400 job advertisements (36.3%) required persons with more than five years’ experience, 198 job postings (18.0%) required persons with two to three years’ experience while 185 job openings (16.8%) required persons with one to two years’ experience (see Figure 8).

Of the 21,180 job postings recorded in 2023, 7,681 (36.3%) required persons with more than five years' experience, 3,789 (17.9%) required persons with two to three years' experience while 3,380 (16.0%) required persons with three to four years' experience (see Figure 9).

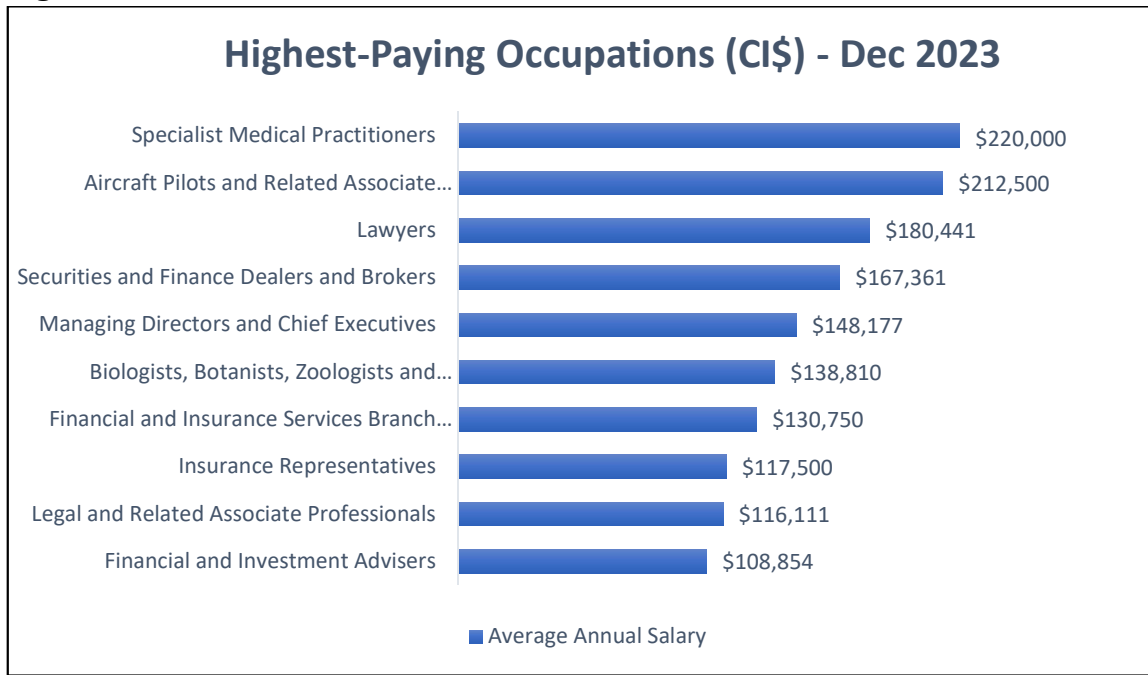


## Salary

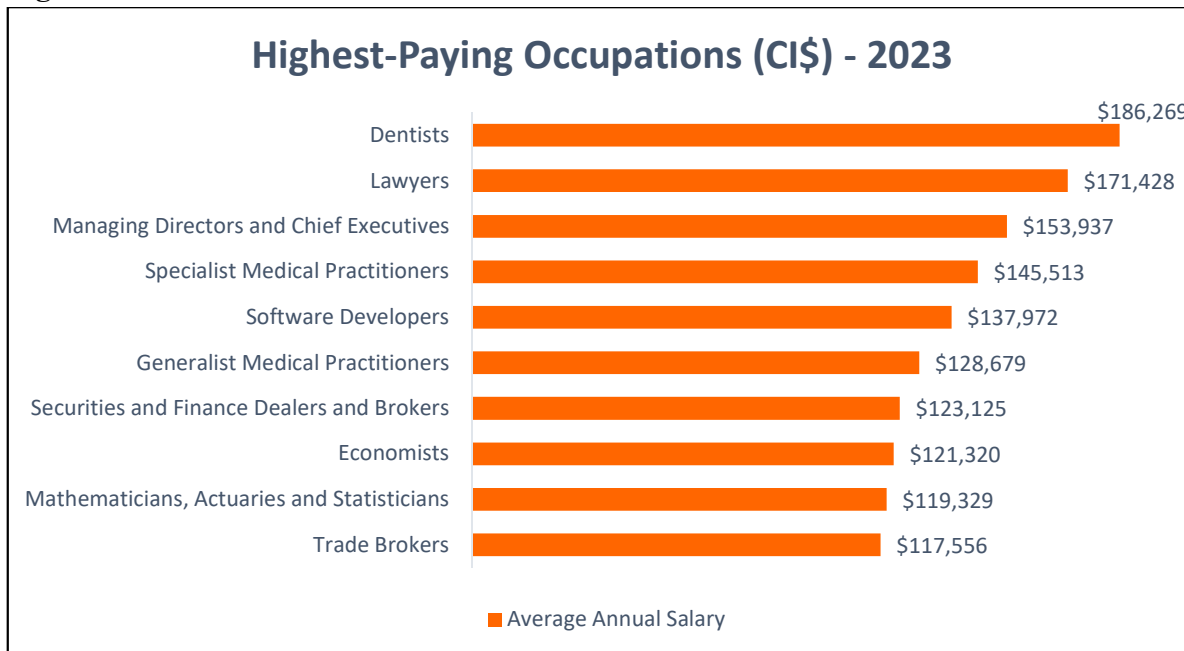


**Figure 10.**

The highest-paying job postings were recorded by Specialist Medical Practitioners in December 2023, with an average annual salary of \$220,000 (see Figure 10). Aircraft Pilots and Related Associate Professionals followed with an average annual salary of \$212,500, after which Lawyers proceeded with an average annual salary of \$180,441.

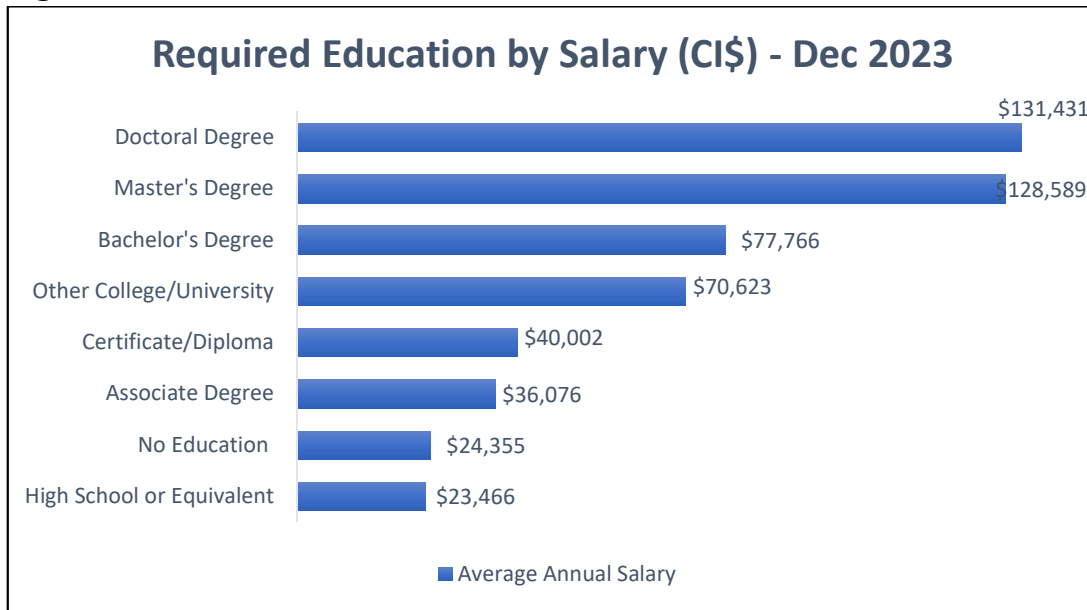
For 2023, Dentists was the highest-paying occupation with an average annual salary of \$186,269 (see Figure 11). Lawyers followed with an average annual salary of \$171,428 while Managing Directors and Chief Executives was next with an average annual salary of \$153,937.

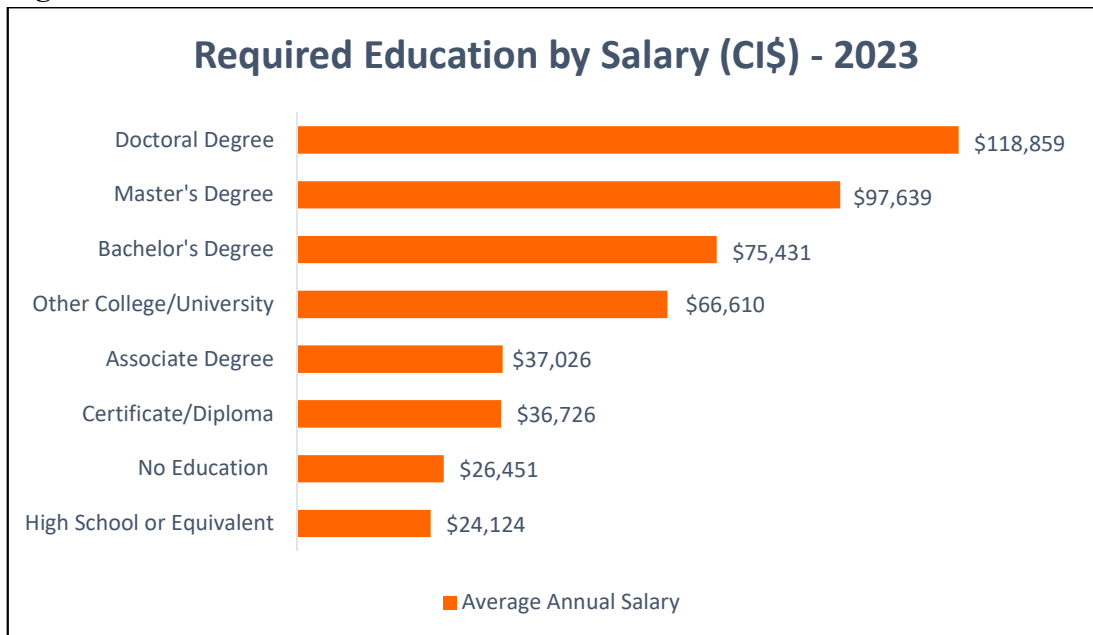
In December 2023, jobs requiring a Doctoral Degree paid the highest average annual salary of \$131,431. Jobs requiring Master's and Bachelor's degrees paid average annual salaries of \$128,589 and \$77,766, respectively (see Figure 12).

For 2023, jobs requiring a Doctoral Degree paid the highest average annual salary of \$118,859. Jobs requiring Master’s and Bachelor’s degrees paid average annual salaries of \$97,639 and \$75,431, respectively (see Figure 13).

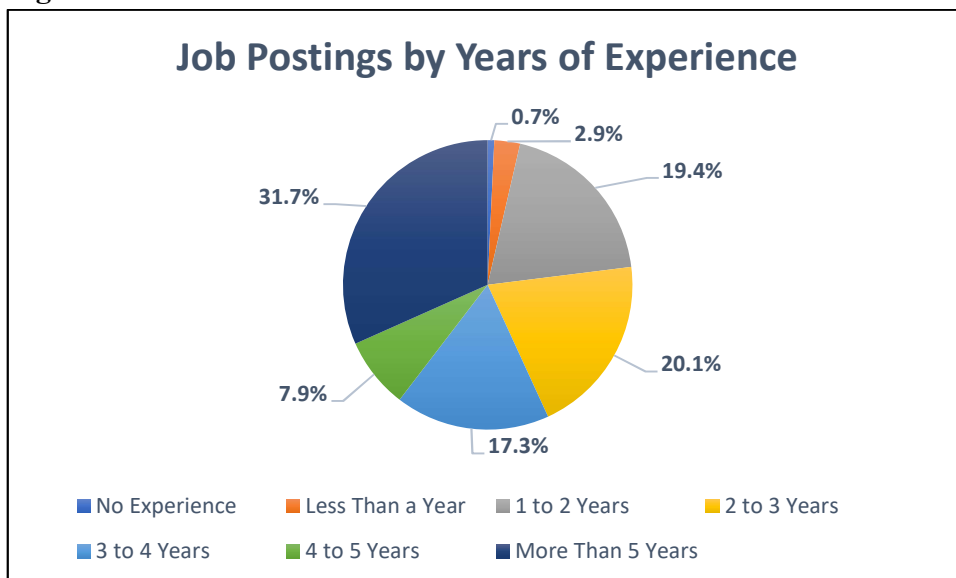

## Summary

---

- A total of 1,103 job postings in December 2023 relative to 1,578 postings the previous month.
- The Accommodation and Food Service Activities, Construction, and Administrative and Support Service Activities industries dominated the job postings for the month and YTD period.
- The most required level of educational attainment was for persons with high school or equivalent qualification followed by a Bachelor's Degree for the month and YTD period.
- Persons with five years or more experience were the most desired in both review periods.
- Job postings in the information technology, healthcare, legal, financial services, actuarial and architectural career fields accounted for most of the highest salaries offered in both review periods.
- Higher levels of educational attainment correspond with increased levels of income.

## Recommendations

---

One of the key ways to improve a person's prospect and quality of employment, and ultimately to enhance an individual's standard of living, is to raise his or her level of educational attainment. As Figures 12 and 13 show, there is a direct positive correlation between required education and salary earned. Therefore, strategies geared towards supporting education and training should be advocated to increase productivity, raise earnings, enhance job stability and improve standard of living. **Programs should be industry-focused, time-based and adhere to global standards to ensure the most efficient use of resources and guarantee the highest return on investment.** Notably:

- There should be increased public-private partnerships to address key bottlenecks such as the skills gap in the local labour market (*see recommendations from the May 2023 report and previous editions*).
- There needs to be collaboration with the Ministry of Education to bridge the gap between labour needs and the supply of labour by sharing local and global labour market information. This information will provide critical insight into the jobs and skills of the future and allow the Ministry of Education to intervene at an early stage to better inform and prepare students.
- Central Government, being one of the largest employers in the economy, should continue its thrust towards investing in learning and training on the job to prepare staff for the future of work and better assist employees in transitioning from declining roles to emerging ones. The future of work will be one with greater technology advancement, particularly with the increased adoption of artificial intelligence in business processes. Therefore, the Central Government's workforce will need to be more 'agile' to adapt and thrive in the future world of work.
